HB1505 – Special Session

- \$88.3M for construction, renovation, maintenance and equipment for new and expanding CTE Centers and facilities
 - Preference provided for applications that foster cross district partnerships
 - Preference provided for applications involving Post-Secondary Partnerships
 - Preference provided for applications involving Workforce Training Partnerships
- 1-1 matching grant
- Grant range will be \$500,000 to \$10M
- Source of the funds:
 - \$20M American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA)
 - \$68.3 Coronavirus Capital Projects Fund (CCPF)



Federal Grant Process

The process for requesting Capital Projects Fund grant funding involves four main steps, described in detail below.

- 1. Submission of an Application to Treasury establishing Applicant eligibility. (12/27/21)
- 2. Execution of a Grant Agreement with Treasury.
- 3. Submission of Grant Plans to Treasury, which will be used by Treasury to assess proposed use of funds for alignment with Capital Projects Fund objectives and requirements. (Submitted 2/1/22)
- 4. US Treasury will review upon receipt Grant Plan has yet to be approved



State Board Selection Criteria

Federal Guidance – Must meet all three criteria

- 1. Invests in capital asset designed to directly enable work, education and health monitoring.
- 2. Capital Project is designed to address a critical need that resulted from or was made apparent by the COVID-19 public health emergency.
- 3. Capital Project is designed to address a critical need of the community to be served by it.



State Board Selection Criteria

State Guidance

Facility and Governance

- Application includes information concerning location and allocation of space. Partner school districts are identified.

Needs Assessment and Programming

- Application includes a needs assessment, identifying workforce needs and student interests. Proposed and expanding programs align with needs assessment results.

Post-Secondary and Workforce Partners

Application identifies post-secondary and workforce offerings, to be housed within the facility.
 Budget Proposal

The application includes a detailed budget. Match commitments are identified.

Additional support may be needed:

- Due to inflation, delivering what was included in the applications will be difficult
 - Current constructions costs up 20-40% since applications were submitted in December
 - Estimated 1.25-1.50% increase every month
 - Continued delay in access to federal funds will continue to contribute to higher construction costs
- Additional support for Career and Technical Education Centers for ongoing operations is vital
