## NORTH DAKOTA—BY THE NUMBERS

Dakota Access Pipeline began operations in June of 2017 and has been paying millions in property taxes each year. In North Dakota, the pipeline has paid over \$12.7 million in property taxes from 2014 – 2018, and is projected to pay \$6.7 million in property taxes in 2019. These tax dollars have been used to support schools, hospitals, emergency services and other critical ongoing needs. The pipeline has also benefitted local agencies and organizations in North Dakota through donations to emergency management agencies, 4H and FFA chapters, the University of Mary and its workforce program, and many others.

During construction, the pipeline paid more than \$11.2 million in sales taxes to North Dakota on items sold to the project. Construction also generated approximately 3,000 – 4,000 construction jobs in North Dakota which further benefitted local communities through goods and services purchased by construction personnel.
